Zazanilia is a nahuatl word that means to tell nice stories, to tell fables, to enjoy the moment. There is no need to define a new Musical form for this movement, but yet, by using known styles let's make the content by different meanings, to describe a place, a puppet, a moment, an art work, anything that make us enjoy that special moment, despite, the nature of musical perception itself remains imperfectly understood.
